MINISTERIAL ORDER

32/2012

FIRE CONTROL ORDER

1. I, Bruce Mayer, Assistant Deputy Minister, Forestry Division, Environment and Sustainable Resource Development, pursuant to s.21 of the *Forest and Prairie Protection Act* (the "Act"), HEREBY:
 - a. SUSPEND all fire permits issued under the Act,
 - b. REQUIRE all outdoor fires presently burning whether set under the authority of a fire permit or not, extinguished, and
 - c. PROHIBIT the lighting of outdoor fireswithin all of Fire Control Zones 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32 and 33; and within that portion of Fire Control Zone 7, south of the Red Deer River (all such Zones are as defined in the *Fire Control Zone Regulation*, being Alberta Regulation 29/2005).
2. For greater certainty, but without limiting the generality of the prohibitions set out in section 1, this Order prohibits the use of:
 - a. portable campfires;
 - b. any open fires used for any purposes in random camping areas; and
 - c. smudge fires.

3. Notwithstanding section 1, this Order does not apply to:
- a. fires which are contained in cooking and heating appliances, other than portable campfires, and which are fuelled by fluids or compressed gas;
 - b. fires contained in fire pits in designated camping and recreation areas;
 - c. fires contained in walled tents with air tight stoves with proper screening as approved by a forest officer; and
 - d. fires contained in industrial facilities or on industrial sites as approved by a forest officer.
4. This order does not apply to land within the boundaries of any city, town or village (including a summer village) or to any land owned by the Government of Canada in respect of which the Minister of Environment and Sustainable Resource Development has not entered into a fire control agreement under section 6(b) of the Act.
5. This Order comes into effect at 12:00 o'clock p.m. on the 21st day of September 21, 2012.
